# Dairy Farm Monitor Project 2018-19 Northern Victoria Overview

- The Dairy Farm Monitor Project provides industry and government with timely, farm level data for developing targeted strategy and decision making.
- Encourages the application of whole farm analysis principles on Victorian farm businesses.
- In Northern Victoria, 25 farms were analysed.

#### **Dairying in Northern Victoria**




Approximately **1,130** dairy farms in Northern Victoria produced **1.69** billion litres of milk in 2018-19, accounting for **30%** of Victoria's milk production.

## Physical farm characteristics

 On average, farms in the North maintained stocking rate but increased average herd size.



Average herd size 399 cows




Milk solids sold 524 kg MS/cow



Home grown feed 60% of metabolisable energy consumed

# 2018-19 was a challenging year for Northern Victorian dairy farms with only 10 of the 25 farms recording a positive EBIT



### Farm profitability was influenced by



**92%** in irrigation costs to **\$0.79/kg MS**; price of temporary water increased substantially



**46%** ★ in concentrate costs as price increased to **\$513/t DM** 



**69%** of long-term average rainfall with **336 mm** in 2018-19



7% ↑ in milk price to \$6.28/kg MS

### **Future expectations 2019-20**



**71%** expect farm profits to improve, up from **65%** the previous year

Climate/seasonal conditions



Water



Input costs
